

Pygmy Bluetongue Conservation Association



The **Pygmy Bluetongue Conservation Association** (PBTCA) is dedicated to the conservation of the Pygmy Bluetongue lizard; a unique endangered species that was rediscovered in Burra in 1992. Established in 2013, the PBTCA is a not-for-profit organisation. Since its inception it has developed the Pygmy Bluetongue Conservation Committee (PBTCC) which consists of a dedicated and passionate team who oversee the organisation. The committee is instrumental in developing:

- ◆ Information to raise awareness of the Pygmy Bluetongue
- ◆ Activities and events which enable people to see the Pygmy Bluetongue and learn about its habitat and conservation needs. Activities and events held to date include a quiz night, a stall at the Redbanks Family Day, presentations at landholder information meetings, a “Little Lizard Dreaming” art exhibition and a PBTCA logo competition.

The committee meets in Burra four times a year and is supported by a PBT Community Liaison Contractor. Volunteers are invited to participate at activities and events.
